# Observation of Play and Learning (OP&L)

At BEYA, your child's learning will be closely monitored with your support, to ensure that children are helped to reach significant milestones for their age.

We use our OP&L milestones to assess your child's development and plan their future learning. (Milestones are available to view on our Parent Padlet)

OP&L allows us to celebrate each child's individual journey and focus on the support they need from us. The observations and assessments that we make are called 'spotlights'. We observe children's innovation, their creativity, their ideas, their intents and feelings. The insight that we gain enables us to support and shape their future learning.


OP&L follows a simple, three step cycle:

# **BEYA School Development Plan 2022-2023**

What are our main aims and priorities this year?

## 1. QUALITY OF EDUCATION

### What do we want to improve or achieve?

To involve parents more fully in our curriculum so that they know what children are learning about and how to help

### What will we do?

Ask parents what they would like to know more about
Plan parent sessions about the curriculum and child development
Increase opportunities for parents to give feedback
Provide more opportunities for parents to spend time in the Nursery
Share monthly summaries of our planning with opportunities for learning to be
extended at home



How will we know it has happened? Parents will tell us that they understand what children are learning about and what they can do at home to support.

## 2. BEHAVIOUR AND ATTITUDES

#### What do we want to improve or achieve?

Highly effective, daily 'nurture group' sessions that support children to gain listening and attention skills



#### What will we do?

Ensure that nurture groups take place daily

Provide training for all staff to ensure appropriate skills and resources are in place. Monitor the sessions and provide feedback to staff.

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Video the sessions for discussion and reflection.

Invite SEN link governor to observe sessions and provide feedback

How will we know this has happened? We will have evidence of effective sessions that have impacted on children's listening and attention skills

## 3. PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

## What do we want to improve or achieve?

Further develop our 'spotlight' planning to celebrate every child's talents, interests and characters. Develop ways to involve the child in the process helping them know what they are good at and what they could learn next.

### What will we do?

Ensure that all staff have sufficient non contact time to reflect and plan Meet regularly with every parent to discuss children's interests and development Monitor 'spotlight' planning to ensure every child's individuality is celebrated and supported

Support staff to observe and confidently talk about the value of the play they observe (Progression in play project)

## How will we know this has happened?

Staff will be able to talk about each child's individual skills and talents. Children will display confidence in their abilities.



# 4. LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT



## What do we want to improve or achieve?

A new staff appraisal system, based on self reflection and peer review

### What will we do?

Make the School Development Plan easily accessible for staff, parents and governors.

Plan meetings to train staff in the new system

Empower staff to set own targets linked to the School Development Plan

Plan time for staff to regularly reflect on their targets and actions

Plan opportunities for peer observations/support.

## How will we know this has happened?

Staff will know their targets. They will able to talk about the ways they have developed their skills and had an impact on children's learning.
