

Admissions Policy

BEYA offers

- Free Early education to children aged 3 5 years
- Free Early Education for two year olds (FEE2) offers eligible children up to 15 hours per week of quality early years education from the term after their second birthday.
- Baby Provision from 6 months old

BEYA is a federation of three outstanding Nursery schools (Brookhill, Hampden Way and St Margaret's) offering places to all children regardless of their race, religion, SEN or any other need. The schools in the federation are part of the education service of the LA and there is no charge for the statutory 15 hours weekly entitlement for each child, 30 hours for eligible children or any 2 year old that accesses FEE2.

Extra provision requested by parents will be subject to a charge and availability. Local authority criteria will be applied when allocating these extra hours.

Out of borough applicants will be considered for admission, after Barnet residents have been offered places.

When to apply

Application for admission to the Nurseries should be made soon after the child's second birthday, and children are normally admitted in the Autumn or Spring term, following their third birthday. For children wanting 2-year old provision we suggest parents put their child's name down when they are 12 months and for babies we suggest from birth.


Places will usually be offered for the 3-5 year old provision in the Autumn term to all children whether you have an autumn or a spring start. On occasion, if there are places available, children may be offered a place in the Summer term. 2-year olds start as soon as they reach 2 years for fee payers and the term after they are two for a funded place. 2-year olds and babies from 6 months can start at any point in the term as long as there are spaces.

There is a minimum requirement of 3 sessions per week for all children

At BEYA we offer places to rising threes. This means that parents can have a nursery place the term before their free entitlement starts but this will be at a cost. For children who are accessing the Free Entitlement for 2-year olds they will have their rising three place funded.

Timetable for admissions

Applications should be received by the school by mid March.



There may be an additional intake subject to availability.

If there are more applications than places available for the next intake, priority will be given to: -

1. Children in the care of the local authority.

- 2. Children with Special Educational Needs.
- 3. Children with exceptional needs (medical, social or other). A written statement must be provided by a doctor, social worker or other professional.
- 4. Children who have a brother or sister attending the school when the places are allocated or who attended the school within the last three years, provided the family has not moved further from the school in the meanwhile.
- 5. *Children of staff currently employed at the school.

6.	6. Remaining places will be offered on a geographical basis taking into account:

Although parents can request a full time place it does not mean they will automatically be given one.
